"In year 6 we have been thinking about plants in science, poems in English and our residential visit to Hill End", reports George.

We have learnt about deltas in Geography, for example the Ganges in Bangladesh. We have also learnt about oxbow lakes, which form when there has been a flood and the river goes straight again, leaving the meander behind. Updated National Guidance
