Road Closure - Information from EWR - Please be advised that Charbridge Lane will be closed from 17th October to 17th December between the Launton roundabout and Charbridge Way. Work will be carried out under normal working hours Monday 7am to Friday 6pm, Saturday 7am to 4pm. Regrettably, due to the extensive nature of the construction works required, the road will be fully closed to road users, cyclists, and pedestrians from Charbridge Way to the Launton roundabout for the entire duration of the closure.

LFD tests are for people who are symptom free. They can identify people who have COVID but have no symptoms, and who could be passing it on to others without knowing.

If you have symptoms of COVID -19

If you, your child or anyone in the household has symptoms that could be COVID, no matter how mild, you need to get a PCR test.
